


# African City Navigator for Service and Resiliency







Floods could cause loss of life and damage to structures, crops, land, flood control structures, roads and public services. Flooding could also cause erosion and landslides, and even can carry debris and toxic products causing secondary damage.

## 1. Prepare for unexpected spills

All rivers in the Douala region can be flooded, and all structures in their floodplains are at risk of being flooded. In extreme cases, heavy rains can also cause flooding in areas far from streams and rivers. Use the resources below to access information on flood safety tips, current weather conditions and proper sandbag construction.

### 2. Resources

Flooding can occur anywhere, but areas near flood plains are at higher risk. Floods could cause loss of life, damage to structures, crops, land, roads, water supply, etc. Flooding could also lead to erosion, landslides, and even can carry debris and toxic products causing secondary damage. In extreme cases, heavy rains can also cause flooding in areas far from streams and rivers. Given the danger posed by floods, it is important to be prepared, informed and know what to do when the need arises. Preparing for a flood before it happens can save you valuable time when you need it most. Know your risks, plan a possible evacuation and organize yourself in advance. These measures will help you avoid damage to life and property. Below are the critical steps for your preparation:



### 1. Determine if you live in or near a floodplain

Find your location in relation to the floodplain by entering your address or the nearest point of interest to your home (e. g. hospital, school, church) into the flood management application (app). Please also consult your local authorities for more information based on previous floods in your area of residence.

### 2. Know your emergency and disaster management focal point

Consult the neighborhood chief, mayor or sub-divisional officer office for information on coordinating emergencies and disasters in your neighborhood. In addition, visit the link with toll-free numbers and emergency services if available in your city.


### 3. Identifier l'emplacement des point d'intérêts critiques


Locate the nearest shelters and hospitals and make sure to follow published evacuation routes in case of flood or disaster.


### 4. Organize yourself in a practical way


Make sure that your mobile phone is charged and able to receive SMS alerts. In addition, be reassured that you have subscribed to the DEIS automatic alert.
