




- Financed by the European Union under the 10<sup>th</sup> European Development Fund (EDF)

- Formally launched in the margins of the Third International Conference on Financing for Development in Addis Ababa on July 14, 2015



# ADRF Technical Assistance

#### **Enabling**

ADRF activities supported the design or implementation of a development investment.

- Cabo Verde: Cat-DDO (US\$10 million)
- Kenya: Cat-DDO (US\$200 million)
- Malawi: Cat-DDO (US\$70 million)
- **Mozambique**: DRM and Resilience Program (US\$90 million IDA, US\$8 million GRIF, US\$36.27, Gvt. funding)

### Informing


ADRF activities helped conceive larger investments (e.g. through diagnostics, knowledge products, etc.).

- Kenya: KSEIP (US\$72 million)
- Niger: Safety Net Program (US\$5 million) and IRM (\$13 million)
- Uganda: NUSAF3 (US\$12 million)









